## CARROLL COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS 1+1+2 PATHWAY

Carroll County Public School students can complete the following courses at CCHS prior to graduation. By doing so, they will have completed one year of the A.S. in Education degree. Overall, CCHS students will have the opportunity to complete 38 of 63 degree credits as part of dual enrollment studies.

Students will be able to attend WCC following graduation and possibly utilize the Twin County Community Foundation Scholarship (with qualification and completion of needed financial aid/Foundation requirements) for the final year of the respective degree. If attending full-time, students can complete their associate degree as a traditional student in one year. Students can then matriculate on to a four-year college/university for ultimate licensure and baccalaureate degree completion.
