Additionally, secondary students and homeschooled students may take courses with WCC instructors after receiving the school's approval. An approval letter from the school must be provided prior to enrollment. Following receipt of the school approval letter, the Coordinator of Dual Enrollment will take this letter (along with any supporting documents) to the President for final review and approval/denial. The President's decision is final.

Students and families are responsible for normal tuition [costs](#), along with any required course materials. Students must meet normal placement requirements and course prerequisites.
